About Uplift

Uplift Center for Grieving Children offers free therapeutic grief groups led by Master's-level clinicians who provide trauma-responsive and healing-centered support. Groups allow youth and families to express their grief through non-judgmental discussions, creative activities, grounding techniques, and other forms of therapeutic support. All grief services are free for youth and families, regardless of immigration status, and do not require insurance.

Uplift's Services

All grief groups are led by a Master's degree-level Uplift Clinician and may include trained volunteers or clinical interns.

Uplift's grief groups are for youth in grades K-12 and their caregivers who have experienced a significant death(s) from any cause. This death can be of any significant person—a family, friend, loved one, and more—and can be from any amount of time ago.



In-School Grief Groups

Held in partnering K-12 schools in Philadelphia (District, charter, private, and religious).

Students are grouped by age and developmental level.

When: During the school day for about one hour a week, for 6 weeks.

Where: In-person at their school.



Family Grief Groups

Open to families from throughout the Greater Philadelphia region.

Ongoing groups run from September through May every year.

Youth (K-12 grades) are grouped by developmental level with separate groups for caregivers.

When: Evenings, once a week for an hour.

Where: Held virtually on Zoom and/or in person.

Specialized Services Offered at select times in the year



Español Grief Groups are for Spanish-speaking children and their caregivers to attend together in the evenings. Held virtually.



Resilient Parenting for Bereaved Families offers proven parenting tools over 10 weeks to caregivers that support and enrich relationships with their grieving children. Held virtually.



LGBTQIA+ Groups are for youth in grades 8-12 to also explore the losses relevant to the LGBTQIA+ community. Held virtually.



Uplift provides grief groups at the Philadelphia Juvenile Justice Services Center for youth in detention. Held in person.



Uplift can offer **Legacy Grief Groups** for the students most significantly impacted by the death of a student or staff member. Held in person.



Uplift's Professional Development and Trainings equip teachers, counselors, social workers, and therapists to better understand grief and trauma and to support grieving children. Held virtually and in person, both in and beyond Philadelphia.
